Since 1982, The Ernest C. Manning Awards Foundation has been creating a culture of innovation in Canada by discovering, honoring and rewarding Canadian innovators of all ages. Stories are told of individuals who improve the lives of Canadians and others around the world because of their commercialized innovations.

Nominees may be eligible for one of four Awards, from the \$100 000 Principal Award to the \$10 000 Innovation Award. Young Canadians participating in the Canada-Wide Science Fair may be eligible for one of eight Young Canadian Awards and one of four Young Canadian Innovator Awards. Here are the names of the 2015 Southern Alberta nominees:

- Iwain Lam, Fabrizio Chiacchia; Hospital surface restoration technology.
- Sean Krakiwsky, Greg McFeetors; Nuclear Magnetic Resonance Spectrometer
- Ross Thurston; Manure Management Technology recycling clean water and recovering fertilizer nutrients.
